

ORDINANCE NO. 2010-029

DIRECTING THE WARREN COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS TO SUBMIT TO THE ELECTORS OF THE VILLAGE OF WAYNESVILLE, OHIO, AT THE NOVEMBER 2, 2010, GENERAL ELECTION, CERTAIN CHARTER AMENDMENTS TO SECTIONS 4.15(A), 7.03, 7.05(A), 7.07, 7.09, 7.10, AND 11.04 OF THE VILLAGE CHARTER (PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT CHANGES)

WHEREAS, the Village of Waynesville Charter Revision Commission has recommended certain alterations, revisions, and amendments to the Charter of the Village of Waynesville; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Village Council to submit said alterations, revisions, and amendments to the electors of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Waynesville, Ohio, \_\_\_\_\_ members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the following amendments to the Charter of the Village of Waynesville, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, shall be submitted to the electors of the Village of Waynesville as a single issue at the general election to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of November, 2010, at the regular places of voting in said Village as established by the Board of Elections:

Section 2. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance to the Board of Elections of Warren County, Ohio, and the Clerk is directed to provide notice of the proposed Charter amendments to the electors of the Village as required by law.

Section 3. That this Ordinance provides for the submission of a question to the electorate and shall be effective immediately upon its passage pursuant to Section 4.08 of the Village of Waynesville Charter.

EXHIBIT A

SECTION 4.15 REVIEW AND CODIFICATION OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

At least one year prior to codifying or recodifying ordinances and resolutions, the Council shall appoint an Ordinance Review Commission of not less than five nor more than seven qualified electors of the Municipality. It shall be the duty of this Commission to review the existing ordinances of the Municipality and make recommendations to the Council for removal from the records of the Municipality any such ordinances which may have outlived their usefulness or practicality. The Commission shall submit its report to Council within one year after its appointment. The Council shall then take such action as it deems warranted with respect to the recommendations of the Commission.

7.03 There shall be a Planning Commission consisting of not less than five nor more than seven members appointed by Council: two of whom shall be members of Council appointed for a term of one year. Citizen members shall serve four year overlapping terms of office. The citizen members of the Planning Commission shall hold no other municipal office or board membership.

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7.05(A) There shall be a Board of Appeals consisting of not less than five nor more than seven citizen members appointed by Council to serve four year overlapping terms of office.

7.07 There shall be a Board of Parks and Recreation consisting of not less than five nor more than seven members: appointed by Council one of whom shall be a member of Council appointed for a term of one year, citizen members to serve four year overlapping terms of office.

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SECTION 7. 09 HISTORICAL PRESERVATION BOARD — MEMBERSHIP.

The Historic Preservation Board shall consist of not less than **five not more than seven** members appointed by the Council. These appointees shall include one member of the Planning Commission, one member of Council, one member of the Waynesville Business Community and residents or property owners from within the district and one member of the Waynesville Historical Society (if the Historical Society goes out of existence, then four residents). Appointment will be for two year overlapping terms, except for the Council and Planning Commission members whose terms may change annually.

7.10 The Historical Preservation Board shall maintain and enhance the distinctive character of Waynesville’s historic preservation districts and listed properties by safeguarding the architectural integrity of the various historic structures and enforcing the Waynesville Historical Preservation Board rules and regulations.

Deleted: The Historical Preservation Board shall provide the formal process to approve or disapprove, within the Historic Preservation District, the external design of proposed new buildings or structures, or of such proposed changes in existing buildings or structures as would substantially alter their appearance, by enforcing the “Waynesville Historical Preservation Board Rules and Regulations” and the municipal ordinances which apply to the “Historic Preservation District.” The Board shall meet twice each month before regularly scheduled Council meetings to consider applications for Certificates of Appropriateness submitted by property or business owners.¶

SECTION 11.04 CHARTER REVIEW COMMISSION.

In January, ~~2010~~ and thereafter at least every ~~ten~~ years, the Council shall appoint a ~~Charter Review Commission. The Charter Review Commission will consist of~~ not less than 9 nor more than 13 qualified electors of the Municipality. This commission shall review the whole Charter and shall recommend to the Council any alterations, revisions, and amendments to this Charter as in the Charter Review Commission's judgment seem advisable. The Council shall submit to the electors all such proposed alterations, revisions, or amendments to this Charter at the next regular election in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Ohio. The Council may by an affirmative vote of at least six members refuse to put on the ballot any or all of the recommendations from the Charter Review Commission. Each Charter Review Commission shall cease to function the day following the election at which its proposals are submitted to the electorate. The members shall serve without compensation. In addition, the Council may appoint additional such commissions for the limited purpose of reviewing specified portions of the Charter.

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
